A document circulating in the family says: Admiral Charles Van Lower was sent by the Holland Government to find the North Pole in 1812. He succeeded, to the satisfaction of the government, and they gave him a grant of Land in Illinois which Peoria now covers. Van Lower's Descendants were Charles Van Lower, Clara Van Lower, Evangeline Van Lower and John Van Lower. The "Van" was dropped by Charles Lower. Evangeline married John Hamilton of Michigan a descendant of the Hamiltons of England. I do have a copy of a photo that is said to be Charles Lower.
Specific question(s) or goal(s) for consultation	I have been unable to find any information on my gr gr gr grandfather Charles Bertrand's parents or siblings. None of the "facts" in the family lore document seem credible. I do know from bible records that Charles Bertrand was born April 25, 1825 in either Ripley, Chautauqua, NY or Eagle, Wyoming, NY (two different bible records - the Ripley location appears in the older bible). And he had to adopt my Mother, so she could also have a passport as Russian refugees couldn't leave Shanghai without a passport to flee to another country.
