She was one of 4 children, Zina, Maria, Katya and Alexander. She claimed her ethnicity is Turkish Muslim, but DNA does not reveal that claim. Family folklore is that her parents, Josef and Irina left Turkey seeking adventure and wealth, traveling east to the emerging frontier town of Vladivostok in the late 1800s. They built a successful life until the Bolshevik Revolution, where everything was lost. The son was killed, and the 3 girls all married foreigners to escape Russia. Maria married at 16 in 1920, had a baby girl (my Mother), and fled Vladivostok in early 1921.
