


1864 "Slave Census" or "Slave Statistics"


As a result of the November 1, 1864 manumission of all enslaved persons in Maryland, as well as the selfemancipation of enslaved persons joining the Union Army, in 1867 and 1868 it was possible for enslavers to be compensated for their financial losses. In St. Mary's County, about 3/4 of enslavers completed this paperwork. Although the original documents for many counties are online, only St. Mary's County and Charles County have been transcribed and completely indexed:


