




 - Fold3.com (military records)












Wildcards


- Symbols used to replace or represent one or more characters

 - − Ros? → Rose, Rosa, Rosy, Ross

Research Guides

- Tools created to help you identify various resources relating to a particular subject
 - Also called subject guides and libguides
 - May contain recommendations for books, articles, collections, databases, web resources
- Many repositories have created research guides related to African American history and genealogy
- Can help you get acquainted with the repository's resources

Finding Aids

- Describe the history of a collection and how the materials are arranged
- Parts of a finding aid:
 - Summary of the collection
 - Abstract or brief biography
 - Inventory outline (includes series, boxes, folders, items)
 - Linear feet
